

N.B. This activity is to activate your prior learning and encourage you to think about the text and genre conventions you are already aware of. Good luck!


#### Activity 2:

- Now, have a go at writing the back cover blurb for the book based on your predictions!





- How many lines make up each stanza?












See if you can draw Mikka and Cat's reflection in the mirror.

This Christmas is cancelled, I'm sorry to say.






What a shake! What a shock! An unthinkable twist For a village of elves, who'd expected a list.






This page needs more ribbons. Can you help?

Now these bows need a gift, Mikka thought as she sat, 'And I wonder,' she said, 'what to do about that?'




#### She tiptoed downstairs, when —




Mikka piped up, quite proudly, 'No stuff has been thieved.' (Expecting her folks Would be rather relieved.)




#### Activity 9:







- What should or could you do?





























Knitting jumpers and pandas

















#### Activity 13:


